



- Pediatric medical resources are limited



What is the NYC Pediatric Disaster Coalition

- Founded in 2008
- Supported by HHS Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response (ASPR) Hospital Preparedness Program (HPP) funds, and administered by the NYC DOHMH
- Principal Investigators at Maimonides Medical Center Children's Hospital and Pediatric Trauma Center
- Collaborate with hospitals across NYC, FDNY-EMS, NYC Emergency Management, DOHMH, MRC
- Focus on planning and exercises with hospitals, primary/urgent care and long term care facilities
- Provide pediatric expertise for public health emergencies (e.g., H1N1, Hurricane Sandy, Ebola)
- Member of the New York City Health Care Coalition (NYCHCC)
- Advance Pediatric Disaster Planning through leadership in national/International organizations
- Presenting at local, national and international conferences to promote pediatric disaster preparedness





Pediatric Disaster Coalition: Goal and Mission

Goal: Prepare NYC for a pediatric mass casualty event by matching resources to needs. To provide the best care possible for pediatric patients during disasters. To develop and disseminate information and guidance on pediatric disaster planning and response on a local, national and international level.

Mission:

- For every child to receive the highest standard of care during and after a disaster.
- For every hospital and community facility to have a plan specifically addressing the needs of children
- For NYC to operationalize a citywide pediatric disaster plan from scene triage to primary and secondary transport to facility surge/evacuation through exercises and developing lessons learned from real events
- For the PDC to act as subject matter experts for both planning and response for children in disasters
- To advocate for children and disseminate information on pediatric disaster planning





Pediatric Disaster Coalition – Accomplishments

NYC Pediatric Disaster Plan

- PDC drafted the NYC Pediatric Disaster Plan in coordination with FDNY-EMS, DOHMH, MRC and NYCEM
- The plan addresses scene triage, initial transport, and coordination of inter-facility transfers of pediatric patients injured in a large-scale mass casualty incident
 - Allows EMS to transport pediatric patients to specific tiered hospitals with pediatric capability
 - Provides Pediatric Critical Care expertise to advise on prioritization of patients for inter-facility transfers to critical care or subspecialty capable hospitals
- Elements of the Pediatric Disaster Plan are being incorporated into current interagency planning for a citywide mass casualty response plan to address the needs of adult and pediatric burn and trauma patients





Pediatric Disaster Surge Exercise in 2017

- Date: May 25, 2017
- Participants: 28 Hospitals; FDNY-EMS Operations, Communications, and Office of Medical Affairs; DOHMH; Medical Reserve Corps; NYC Emergency Management; PDC and Pediatric Intensivist Response Team
- Scenario: Multiple simultaneous explosions at or near schools
- Objectives:
 - 1. To demonstrate interagency coordination of secondary transport of pediatric patients during an activation of the draft NYC Pediatric Disaster Plan.
 - 2. To validate hospitals' ability to surge in response to a large pediatric disaster, triage and prioritize patients that require secondary transport, and communicate with response agencies during an activation of the NYC Pediatric Disaster Plan.
- Selected Outcomes/Lessons Learned:
 - 1. 1105 Pediatric inpatient Surge Beds (baseline 1039) capacity double



254 PICU Surge Beds (baseline 224 beds) – more than double capacity
